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such as Google Lighthouse.

- Digital design best practices and web production techniques, including mobile-first and responsive design
- Visual design principles with a strong emphasis in typography, layout, grid systems, and information hierarchy
- The role of HTML and CSS in the graphic design, visual design, and user experience ecosystem and production workflow
- Industry standard tools such as Illustrator, Photoshop, XD, Figma, or other screen design and prototyping tools.
- Evaluate student progress and provide clear, timely feedback reflecting program learning outcomes and departmental expectations.
- Provide teaching and mentoring services to students in a manner that does not discriminate based on race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, disability, age, protected veteran status, political affiliation, or other protected categories.
- Remain current in the field through a variety of professional development activities.
