- Expertise in developing and implementing visual communication projects related to presidential communications, community magazines, design templates, and campus signage.
- Experience creating multilingual design and brand guidelines, including graphic identity standards and best practices for publications, advertising, collateral materials, digital media, and web platforms.
- Ability to manage, monitor, and update content across social media platforms (Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, X/Twitter, etc.) as needed.



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- Knowledge of social media strategy and demonstrated success in implementing campaigns that strengthen brand visibility, engagement, and community reach.
